About the Trainers

Barbara Jones-Schroyer has been working in the field of domestic violence for over twenty years. She has worked as a facilitator of men's nonviolence classes for the Domestic Abuse Intervention Programs (DAIP) and as a national and international trainer for the DAIP. She has trained counselors, human service staff, military personnel, faith communities and community activists on domestic violence. In collaboration with the DAIP in 2003, she and Ty Schroyer created a class for Christian men called Changing Men, Changing Lives (CMCL). They have written a CMCL curriculum for facilitators and produced a documentary DVD about the class. They co-facilitate a weekly CMCL class in Duluth, MN. Barbara is an adjunct instructor for Lake Superior College, Duluth, MN and is an annual Federal grant reviewer for the Office on Violence Against Women. Barbara has BA in Psychology and MSW.

Graham Barnes has been a criminal justice specialist with the Battered Women's Justice Project in Minneapolis, MN, since November 2005. He consults with federal grantees on developing coordinated community response to domestic violence, and trains on batterer's intervention programs. Previously, Graham was Team Leader of the Domestic Abuse Intervention Project's Training and Resources in Duluth, MN where he developed local Duluth practice on domestic violence into training packages and resources for other communities nationally and internationally. He also facilitated batterer intervention project classes in Duluth. Initially trained as a teacher, Graham has a Diploma in Teaching, a Bachelors Degree in Social Work (Massey University New Zealand), and 20 years experience in community organizing and domestic violence prevention. Over the years, he has worked with communities in New Zealand and Australia, including training on the Duluth model.
