Location Tracking And Technology-Facilitated Stalking

Among tech-facilitated stalking victims, 15% were tracked with a device or app.¹

What is location tracking and stalking?

A tactic of stalking that uses technology (e.g. GPS Bluetooth or hardwired devices) to track the location of a victim.

More than two times as many victims are stalked with technology than without it.²

Abusive partners or ex-partners might:

- Hide a GPS/Bluetooth device in your car in a discrete location
- Download a location tracking app on your phone
- Place a tracking device in your bag/pocket/purse/ backpack
- Use a smart car GPS navigation system to track you
- Tracking devices and children's backpacks or bags.

Signs of location tracking and stalking:

- The person knows where you are, even when you didn't tell them
- Finding an unfamiliar device(s) on, under, or in your vehicle/belonging
- Find apps on your phone/children's phones that you didn't download
- Suspicious notifications on your smart device

Safety Planning Tips

- Trust your gut. If you feel like something is off, listen to your intuition
- Educate yourself on types of tracking devices and what they look like
- Check your car for devices in easy-to-overlook places like under the hood and bumper, around the tires, and power outlets, under seats, etc.
- Turn off location sharing on your phone, GPS, and social media
- Talk with an advocate about safety concerns to create a safety plan
- Change routes and routines to and from frequent locations
- Identify a plan before removing devices/apps.
 Removal could alert the person tracking your location
